1 Name

This instrument is the *Migration (Digital Passenger Declaration—Circumstances where Passenger Card also required) Instrument (LIN 22/015) 2022*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after registration.

3 Definitions

In this instrument:

DPD means a digital passenger declaration provided to the departmental system that processes digital passenger declarations.

Note Some expressions used in this instrument are defined in the *Migration Act 1958* and the Regulations, including *clearance authority* and *clearance officer*.

4 When a passenger card may be required

For subregulation 3.03AB(2) of the Regulations, the following circumstances are specified:

- (a) the person's DPD cannot be accessed by a clearance authority;
- (b) a clearance officer reasonably suspects that the information in the person's DPD is not accurate or complete.
